Question 7: As parents, we feel isolated in relationship to curriculum awareness. The class webpages present general information, without many details (and most of it, is the same year in-year out). Some teachers provide a bit more details with the homework sheets, but that varies from year to year. That doesn't cover all the subjects. In particular, awareness of subjects within the wider curriculum and enrichment (forest schools, science, geography, PHSE etc) is very limited. There are schools that share much of the above (including all homework) with parents /pupils more effectively (see <a href="http://www.williampatten.hackney.sch.uk/parents/google-classroom-homework/">http://www.williampatten.hackney.sch.uk/parents/google-classroom-homework/</a>). It would be great if the school could explore this. Question 8: From experience, the way concerns are dealt within the school varies significantly. It is a shame as she is the face of the school, and her job is customer service. Administrative staff working in the background, are more willing to help, so is the headteacher. Question 15: The school's clubs are not enough for the demand. There were times we were not able to book any clubs at all, or we missed out the ones we wanted as there were no spaces available. The online booking system is very basic (doesn't allow immediate cancellations, doesn't allow multiple child bookings). It is great that the school seeks active parents' involvement, but please make the school more 'working parent friendly'.
