Monday 18 th May	In English , we will read 'Biri and the Marrow' In Maths , we will continue to work on subitising In Phonics , we will listen to sounds in stories In RWE , we will read traditional tales from around the world

<p>In PE lessons the children will learn team games, ball handling and prepare for Sports Day.</p> <p>In Green School, we will explore our school grounds and learn how to stay safe near water. We will learn how worms make compost, how litter affects wildlife and why we need to put it in the right bin. We will see the potatoes we have planted start to grow, and sow some seeds. We will learn about road safety through role play games on the nature trail.</p> <p>We will be taking the children on regular trips to the library.</p> <p>In Music we will remember and sing entire songs.
