Breakfast and After School Clubs will be relocated to the main hall and numbers increased to 50 children per session. MONEY MATTERS

Firstly a big thank you to the **Friends of Coldfall** for all the special events of this year, not least the recent wonderful summer fair and circus; also for continuing to fund the running of the minibus, Abie Longstaff's visit on World Book Day and the Year 5 visit to see Charlie and the Chocolate Factory and the Year 6 visit to 'Bounce'. The Friends will be having a second hand uniform sale in the first week back in September.

Well done to all the children and staff for this afternoon's fantastic **Danceathon** in aid of Educaid. There are certainly some expert movers and shakers in our midst! **We raised the amazing total of over £3,500 for Educaid.** Thank you to all the families who sponsored our children. Thanks are also due to Ms Kavanagh and Ms McNamara for the choreography and instruction.

Dinner money—the cost of a school lunch will increase to £2.40 per child per day from next term. The total for the first half term is £84. Children in Reception, Years 1 and 2 will continue to receive a lunch free of charge.

Breakfast and After School Club—we are also increasing the charges for our out of school hours clubs. Breakfast Club will cost £4.00 per child per session and the price of After School Club will increase to £10 per child per day.
